

OUTSCHOOLED


DESIGN COMPETITION FROM BERNHEIM

WHAT IS INTERIOR DESIGN?

Interior design encompasses the analysis, planning, design, documentation, and management of interior non-structural/non-seismic construction and alteration projects in compliance with applicable building design and construction, fire, life-safety, and energy codes, standards, regulations, and guidelines for the purpose of obtaining a building permit, as allowed by law. Qualified by means of education, experience, and examination, interior designers have a moral and ethical responsibility to protect consumers and occupants through the design of code-compliant, accessible, and inclusive interior environments that address well-being, while considering the complex physical, mental, and emotional needs of people.

ARCHITECT REGISTRATION EXAMINATION® (ARE®) 5.0 CUT SCORES

JUST RELEASED FROM NCARB

If candidates took the Practice Management exam between December 14, 2020, and January 27, 2021, their score report will be processed per their jurisdiction's requirements and may already be viewable in their NCARB Record. If they have tested since January 27 or have a Practice Management exam scheduled in the future, they will be able to receive provisional feedback at the end of your administration and can expect to receive their score report within a few business days of testing.

NCARB anticipates releasing the score reports for Project Management and Project Planning & Design next. The expectation is to release score reports for Programming & Analysis, Project Development & Documentation, and Construction & Evaluation last.

NCARB has stated they will provide updates on the anticipated release of exam scores as necessary, and the candidate will receive an email alert once their score report is ready to view in My NCARB.


